Dr. Mark Elliott is the founder of Collabforge, an innovative consultancy responsible for a number of cutting-edge digital government initiatives within Australia and abroad.

These include the City of Melbourne's Future Melbourne, a multi award winning world-first "City plan that anyone can edit", as well as wePlan Parks Victoria, which leverages social media for the first time to "Help guide the future of Victoria's parks", and the Southern California Bicycle & Pedestrian Planning Wiki, comprising a new approach to public involvement in transportation planning.

Prior to founding Collabforge, Mark completed a PhD investigating the underlying dynamics and mechanisms that drive and enable mass collaboration. Mark has published and delivered keynote presentations on his work at Princeton University, the Lowy Institute for International Policy and was a panelist for the 2009 Personal Democracy Forum's Imagining White House 2.0. Mark is a regular speaker at Government 2.0 events here in Australia and the United States. Most recently, he presented at the United Nations Public Service Conference in Barcelona on Australian digital government initiatives.
